Franco Adami has proven the aging potential (of up to five years) of this wine and I have therefore increased the drinking windows on this excellent Prosecco Superiore. —*Monica Larner*

The delightful 2013 Valdobbiadene Prosecco Superiore Col Credas Rive di Farra di Soligo Brut is the quintessential aperitivo wine to drink in your favorite company of friends and family. The bouquet opens to lemon blossom and white rose. The wine is lively and tight in the mouth thanks to the sharp and focused nature of the perlage. —*Monica Larner*

Franco Adami is the **personification of Prosecco Superiore** with the proverbial effervescence of character to match the bubbly nature of his wines.

He is also extremely talented and **responsible for some of the best Prosecco you will ever drink.**

The single-vineyard Vigneto Giardino has been a top scoring wine in my Prosecco tastings for years now. This wine also helped me understand the aging potential of Glera when vinified with care. Franco once staged a vertical tasting going back almost two decades.

He proved that even Prosecco Superiore can withstand the test of time, despite the naysayers. Franco's label reads "Adriano Adami" because the estate was founded by his father. I have chosen to list it simply as "Adami" as the brand is commonly known.
